**Morning Overview: Quality Curriculum and Instruction: How to Measure Academic Success**

In this opening session, we will focus on the main thing – instruction guided by a strong, quality curriculum. This process will require more attention than ever before. Now that A.I. could have a significant impact on how we approach instruction, we need to be aware of what will be needed to create and adjust to ensure that our approach to teaching and learning does not waiver from the ultimate goal – to prepare our students for life beyond high school.
